Janet talked about half square triangles (HSTs). She gave a handout explaining several different ways to creat HSTs. Especially were the methods of sewing around the outside edges of squares and then cutting them diagonally into fourths or eight wedges, diagonally and the up and down and across.

She then went on to talk about and show projects with HSTs arranged as pinwheels. Using slashing to off set the pinwheels because they can look wonky if not lined up absolutely correctly. She also showed many other layouts including chevrons, spinning spider leg, diamonds, flying geese, etc. She also showed using pieced strips in the pinwheels.

Member challenge is to use any one of these in a project.

This will prevent the borders from coming unstitched when quilting. Just like sewing on a button, you make a knot to keep it in place.

Tonight we will see different ways to put blocks together, (see hand out sheet.) You do not have to follow the pattern because another layout might look better. Remember how many ways a Log Cabin Quilt can be arranged. Thanks
