Jolene reminded everyone of the June challenge - a minimum 12" x 12" square using the color of the year - ultra violet.

The topic for the month was reverse appliqué. Jolene demonstrated how simple raw edge was. She also referenced other methods including needle turn, fusible, freezer paper, and satin stitch. Decorative stitching at the edge is a great finish for the fusible and freezer paper methods. This technique will embellish and/or add depth to a quilt. Jolene challenged all members to give it a try and bring a reverse appliqué piece to the June meeting. Circles were especially emphasized.

The fat quarter draw this month had many participants. Winners were Vicki Ellis, Bonnie Sproull and Elaine Gullison. The June theme is birthday.

White 100% cotton batting 96" wide.

For the hand quilters, **100% polyester batting** 96" wide. Much more uniform consistency than you often get in the packaged poly battings. This could certainly be used for machine quilting as well, creating a lighter weight quilt. Also there is now **100% wool batting**. As well as quilts, some prefer this for wall hangings.

Of course, still the regular **battings** in 96" and 120" widths, both 80/20 cotton/poly and 100% cotton. And several **tone-on-tone cottons** in whites and creams, both in 45" and 108".

More **thread** and **needles**... And more **quilting stencils** for both hand and machine quilting.

Also Ultimate Pounce marking pads and refills!

And don't forget the Janome **sewing machines**. Also repairs to all makes and models.
