### **5" Charm Swap**

PLEASE, I NEED MORE PARTICIPANTS. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself.

Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

Sept - pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only

Oct - green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks

Nov - red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks

Dec - gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks

**Registrar's Report, June, 2022**

Our membership for this quilting year (2021-2022) was 82 members. We had 83 members join last year (2020-2021) and in the beginning of the covid pandemic we had 111 members (2019-2020).

In 2019/20 our last "in person" meeting was March, 2020. There were no "in person" meeting in 2020/21 and in this present quilting year there was a September meeting with 32 members present, a March meeting with 27 members present, an April meeting with 35 members present (2 guests) and a May meeting with 30 members present (1 guest). The June meeting will also take place this quilting year.

At the June meeting Membership Certificates are awarded for 5, 10, 15 and 20 years. Due to the pandemic and the inability to have "in person" meetings, these have not been awarded. They will be at our June meeting and are as follows:
