

February will be a bargello project, a table runner or placemats, led by Linda MacAfee. March 17th will be Debbie Flewelling doing an intermediate free motion quilting class. Debbie urged everyone to choose fabric that was light and bring thread to match. All details are in the newsletter. On April 21st the class will be making a Mondo bag which is very roomy and based on 2 1/2" squares. Sign up must be done by the end of the March meeting so that patterns can be ordered. May 26th's class will be using the quick curve ruler. There was discussion that provided the news that there were enough members with the ruler who would share, so a purchase was not necessary. The fat quarter draw this month was hearts, and were won by Elaine Gullison and Donna Lawrence. March theme is green.

Just a reminder of the next Super Saturday on March 17 Th. Deb Flewelling will be doing a free motion quilting class. This is not a beginner class so be prepared to be challenged. Come and work on your own projects if you don't feel you want to sit in on this class. We have a day of fun and friendship.

Also for the April class we will be doing the Mondo bag and we need to know how many plan on participating as I need to order the pattern kit. The cost is 10\$ per kit. This includes the pattern and the backing. Sign up at guild meeting or call Sue or myself if you are interested.

"Wholecloth Quilting" Super Saturday March 17, 2018

2 – 28 inch square pieces of fabric (solid, white-on-white)

Batting: any type of batting will work.

Blue water- soluble marking pen. (or an erasable/disappearing pen of some type)

If you do not have one, we will provide one for you.

Long ruler and square ruler if possible.

Thread to match fabric.

Safety pins for securing sandwich.

Appropriate feet and general supplies for free motion quilting. (Bring along your walking foot as well as your free-motion foot)

Needle (embroidery or topstitch)

Fat Quarter Draw: This month the theme is Green. Please bring a fat quarter if you wish to participate. Please drop by table when you come to meeting for your ticket stub for draw. April's Fat Quarter will be stars and/or stripes (celebrating our American visitors!!)

How are things coming along designing your Modern Block? I cannot wait to see them all together. Remember 3.5'' blocks 4 wide \times 4 high will give you a finished 12'' block. Please use white, or beige or a neutral in background.

I am excited to see some of your Mystery Quilts. The contrast will be exciting to see.

In January I issued a challenge to make a block or item Min 12×12 " using the Pantone color of the year. All info can be found on our guild website under program.

We have over a hundred members in our guild but the volunteers who repeatedly are willing to help out remain to about 15 members. We have two dates in March (13^{th} and 27^{th}) and only two members have offered time (Ellen Kee and Crystal Brown have signed up for the 13^{th} and there are no names for the 27^{th}). We have found that 3 to 5 guild members make the job go well.

The remaining dates are April 10^{th} and 24^{th} , May 8^{th} and 22^{nd} and June 5^{th} and 19^{th} . We are tying the quilts so it doesn't take much skill and if you have never tied a quilt, this is the place to learn. chance for you to learn a another new technique. The rest of our time is used to assist the residents in the tying process and as usual, if you have time, we are invited to tea and cookies after we are finished quilting. Please give some serious thought to helping out in this area.
