

Tip of the month. Keep metallic threads and or specialty threads in a plastic bag. This keeps them from drying out so it does not snap or break when you use it. If you cannot find the color of thread to match , use a shade darker, as this will act as a shadow and not show as much. Did you know Gutterman Thread spools have a storage space in them for needles. I will show you this at the meeting. Betty Doherty will show you a Row by Row for machine quilting. This is a free site under Jeanne Harrison Free Motion Quilting. This is the supply list:

19 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " cotton fabric of your choice

19 ¹/₂" x 25 ¹/₂" Insulbrite

19 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Silver Iron Board Fabric (Betty and I are sourcing this for you and will subsidize with SS funds – amount depends upon #'s)

Elastic – (2) $\frac{1}{4}$ x 4" long pieces- Don't be afraid to improvise ie. hair elastic

Thread of choice

Bring all of your regular sewing supplies and a pencil. Be sure to bring you rulers too!

Ridge Machine Quilting

Ron and Andrea opened Ridge Machine Quilting in 2017 after their purchase of a manual longarm. They carry a selection of batting and backing fabrics for longarm customers. Andrea does a lot of freehand custom quilting starting at 2.5 cents per square inch.

In January of 2018, they opened an accompanying fabric shop in their home, after the Christmas Crab Quiltery shut down. Since then they continue to bring in new fabrics, which can be seen in their online shop at https://shop.ridgemachineguilting.com

The shop is open Monday thru Friday, 10am to 5pm. On Thursdays they are open until 7pm. On the weekends, you can find Andrea at The Northside Market in Fredericton if you happen to be in town. She can also bring requests since the booth at the Market is small and has duplicate items, remnants, end of bolts and precuts. They also do pick up and drop offs for the quilting services.

I finished a scrap quilt and I would like to now do a charm swap to replenish. <u>5" charm swap</u>

1. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all salvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziplock bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue

You may do multiple sets within each section. Only good quality fabric cut accurately.

April - white/beige - all colors is to be white or beige (no other colors in the charm) no muslin but tone on tone is allowed

May - black - all over color is black, prints allowed, lights to darks

June - blue - all over color is blue, prints allowed, lights to darks

Sept – pink – all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks

Oct - pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only

Nov - green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks

Dec - red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks

Jan - gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks
