



Community Quilts Yearly Report April 30, 2018

This year a total of 46 quilts (May 2017- Apr 2018) were given out. These went mainly to individuals to comfort them in illness but also a few to victims of fire, and 12 baby quilts to the Maternity floor of URVH for mother's in need.

The budget for the 2017-18 year is \$600. To date we have spent \$172.54.

Guild members have been generous -- donating completed quilts, fabric, batting, tops, and backs and by completing and binding quilts. This year we supplied 2 quilt kits per month for tying at Riverside Court

We have on hand 8 comfort quilts, 2 larger quilts, and 6 children's quilts.

We also have 5-6 tops and backs ready for quilting (too large to do at Riverside) and we may have a workshop to complete these.

We have on hand a good supply of fabric thanks to family of Muriel Moorcroft.

A very special thanks to Joan Prosser and Gaynelle Sharkey who have helped with consulting, sorting fabric, and making quilts It was wonderful to have such willing helpers.

Super Saturday:

Super Saturday Supplies for May 26, 2018 Clamshell Quilt using "Quick Curve" Ruler

Besides your regular sewing kit, be sure to bring your rotary cutter, mat, ruler, pencil or fabric marker, and your "Quick Curve" ruler. If you don't have a Quick Curve Ruler please borrow one for this project- there are lots of guild members who have one. We will try to get this organized at our Guild meeting on May 7th.

To make a 52" x 65" (or44" x 55" smaller option) you will need:

10 fat quarters in various prints

2.5 meters in a solid/background fabric

thread to match fabric

backing fabric

binding fabric

Note: 1 fat quarter = 2 clamshells. If you would like to make a larger quilt, adjust your background fabric as well as # of fat quarters.

It would also be great if you could bring (2) 7 ½" squares of contrasting scrap fabric to practice with!

Super Saturday Annual report

We held "Super Saturday" on the third Saturday of the month in Sept, Oct, Nov, Jan, Feb, March, April and May at St Gertrude's Church Hall. We begin at 9 am and finish by 3 pm.

Super Saturday has a "project" every month. We try to provide a good variety – from bags to quilts, to household items and try to present projects so that new skills are taught. We often enlist the help of other guild members who have skills to share. Materials for Super Saturday are listed in the newsletter prior to Super Saturday, and we bring examples to display at our monthly guild meeting. The cost of materials for the projects are the individual quilter's responsibility.

We encourage quilters to attend Super Saturday even if they don't necessarily want to do the project of the day, but would rather work on their own projects. It's a great way to share ideas, get help on a project, and even more importantly, socialize with members of the guild. New quilters are strongly encouraged to take part – it's a great way to learn quilting techniques from a room full of helpful experienced quilters!

The fee is \$5 (\$10 for non guild members) and includes coffee, tea, and a snack. Quilters bring their own lunch. Super Saturday funds are administered by the co-ordinators. Fees cover the cost of the hall rental, and coffee and tea supplies. We also used excess funds to supplement the costs of special supplies needed for some of our Super Saturday projects.

As coordinators we are responsible to book the hall, arrange all of the projects for the year, provide project supplies if needed, open and close the hall, teach or oversee the day, and administer funds.

We have about \$150 in the pot now. At the end of the year we might have a little bit more if we get a good turnout at the next Super Saturday. We have plans to use the excess in the fall for one of our sessions! It's going to be a good one!

We had a great year with fantastic participation. Thanks to everyone for attending Super Saturday. We have some exciting projects lined up for next year-hope to see you there!

After all expenses an amount of \$ 179.00 is left from the \$250.00


The amount cost for the prize will be around \$35.00

new items at Victoria Corner Sewing Machines...

White 100% cotton batting 96" wide.

For the hand quilters, 100% polyester batting 96" wide. Much more uniform consistency than you often get in the packaged poly battings. This could certainly be used for machine quilting as well, creating a lighter weight quilt.

Also there is now 100% wool batting. As well as quilts, some prefer this for wall hangings.

Of course, still the regular **battings** in 96" and 120" widths, both 80/20 cotton/poly and 100% cotton. And several **tone-on-tone cottons** in whites and creams, both in 45" and 108".

More thread and needles... And more quilting stencils for both hand and machine quilting.

Also Ultimate Pounce marking pads and refills!

And don't forget the Janome **sewing machines**. Also repairs to all makes and models.

Come and visit! (I'm usually in the shop, but best to call before you come.) Thanks for your support! It has been very appreciated!
