Thanks to all who attended the last Super Saturday. During the month of December there will be no Super Saturday. The date for January's SS is January 19. The project we will be doing is named "Sonya's Windows." More information in next month's newsletter.

Fons & Porter's Quilt Tips:

- Before washing your fabric, use a permanent marker to write in the selvage the amount of fabric in the piece and the intended use of the fabric.
- In addition to the usual information, transfer a photo of yourself onto the quilt label as
 documentation. Think how much fun it will be years later to see how you looked when you
 completed the quilt.
- Cut a small hole in the lid of an empty whipped topping container. As you remove safety
 pins from pin basting, drop them into the container. The tight lid prevents the pins from
 spilling.
