Opening Remarks

Presentation of approx. 60 bags to River Valley Cancer Support Group - Marilyn Rose and Brenda Dyer accepted the bags as presented by Linda McAffee. The bags are used to hold

donations of towel, facecloth, toiletries, pens and pencils, literature, note pad etc. Approximately 8-10 bags are given out per month to new cancer patients at their first visit to the Upper River Valley Hospital for treatment. This is an on-going project, and the RVCSG was happy to have the bags. They also noted that knitted slippers are a needed item. The annual fund raiser for the URV Support Group is a calendar featuring cancer survivors. They are \$10 and will be on sale at the January meeting; also available at Bank of Montreal, Vanity Flair, Hair Raiser, and the library. Catherine thanked the support group for the work they do.

Presentation of Quilts to Sanctuary House - Jennifer Pitts accept 12 quilts from the guild for use at Sanctuary House which is a place for women and children who have been abused to get a new start. The women usually come with only the clothes they are wearing. Staff help them access available resources in community. Most women are there short term [1-3 months] with staff supplying basic needs during stay and to get set up in a new place, from donations. They also try to supply Christmas for families who have been through the home and still need assistance. Donations are welcome.

Fons & Porter's Quilt Tips:

- 1. For smooth edges on a quilt label, pin the label right sides together with a piece of muslin or lightweight interfacing. Machine stitch around the label. Cut a slit in the centre of the lining, turn the label right sides out through the opening, and press. Hand stitch the prepared label to the quilt.
- 2. Pin applique elements to the background fabric from the back instead of the front. The thread will be less likely to catch on pins as you stitch.
- 3. To help prevent sore fingers when quilting, try this remedy. Apply a little Nuskin liquid Bandage to the end of your finger. Press on a little dab of cotton ball and then more liquid bandage. The combination stiffens to an almost cast-like hardness.

Program, January 2013

Welcome to the New Year! Are you ready to start sewing/quilting again? I know Janet and I are very excited to get back into the swing of things!

- 1. Work on and finish those <u>Box Top Challenges</u>! Remember, it doesn't have to be a quilt, just something made using your box top as inspiration. It could be the colors, or the design, or the subject...let your imagination go where it wants and create. Create something traditional or something completely out of the box! (no pun intended lol) <u>Bring your finished challenge and your box top to February meeting fastened together</u>. Pass them into Janet Wright.
- 2. Jelly Roll Lotto: this month's 2 1/2" strip color is Light, Med, or Dark Blues> remember, you can enter as many strips as you want but they must all be from a different fabric and no novelties. You get an entry for EACH strip you bring@ Janet Wright is accepting the strips for this month.
- 3. Mystery Quilt, Clue 4: We're getting close to the finish line with our Mystery Quilt! Are you caught up? No! Well, let's get moving!

In this clue, we are going to start some block assembly. So, there is no difference in the instructions for Choice A or Choice B. You will all be making the same block. The only difference is that Choice B people will be assembling more blocks in total. Choice A-you will assemble 20 blocks and Choice B-you will assemble 30 blocks.

You will need:

All your "C" units from Clue 2—these are 6 ½" pieced squares. Make sure they are squared to that measurement before you start block assembly.

All your "Strip Unit D" and "Strip Unit E" from Clue 3 -Keep them in separate piles. Make sure that they measure the correct size that was given in Clue 3 before you start block assembly.

Extra pins that you can leave in your blocks until after the last clue. Flat head pins work best!

Before we start sewing, please note in the diagram the position of Unit C. You want Unit C to be facing so that the last piece sewn onto Unit C is at the top and bottom. This was the long strip unit from Clue 2. Since these units all need to be facing the correct way before we sew on "D" and "E", I stacked all mine in the correct position and placed a pin in the top row so that I wouldn't get them turned around. Also, I would suggest you leave this pin in, even after piecing the new block, as you will need to know the same "top" position for the last clue.

Referring to the diagrams below, you will join "D" and "E" units to "C" unit to make "Block Unit F".

First, sew "Strip Unit D" to each side of Unit C. Press the Unit D sections towards the outside of the block.

Next, sew "Strip Unit E" to the top and bottom of your new unit C. Press the Unit E sections towards the outside of the block. You have now created "Unit F".

Square the block "Unit F" to measure 9 1/2" x 9 1/2".

If you like, move the pin up into the newly added top piece, Strip E.

Choice A should have 20 completed blocks. Choice B should have 30 completed blocks. Bag them and label "Unit F".
