## Fons and Porter's Quilt Tips:

- to stabilize fabric to make writing on it easier, place strips of masking tape on the wrong side of the fabric just under the area where you want to write.
- Before you pre-wash fabric, snip the selvage corners off. The snip helps reduce raveling and remind you later that the fabric has been prewashed and is ready to use.
-Nothing is too small to be useful. Use tiny scraps of fabric to stuff toys and pillows.


## It's a Mystery

We are now ready to make our third set of blocks. You will be making 8 in total, 4 will face one direction, and the other 4 will face the opposite direction. In other words, 4 and 4 reverse.

To make 1 block you will need $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square , $121 / 2$ by $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, and $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, all of colour 2 . You will also need $221 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles if you are using a jelly roll, or $141 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, and $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle of background fabric.

Sew the square to the $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle, and the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to the $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Sew the two $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangles together, if using.

You should now have 4 rectangles that are 10 1/2" long, 3 are 2 1/2" wide and 14 1/2" wide.
Lay them out as a block. Colour 2 full strip, the pieced strip with the longer colour 2 strip above it withe the background on the right, the pieced strip with the shorter colour 2 strip above it with the background on the right, and the wider background strip at the top. Sew them together. Make three more. Then make 4 blocks with the background on the left. They should look like steps.

And we are done all the blocks for the small and medium sized quilts.
