## Cat Beds:

We are looking for someone to continue this project. There may be issues with Dunroamin, in that do they even want cat beds. So, could someone please take this on to find out if the shelters want the cat beds, and, if they do, coordinate the creation, collection and delivery of them. Actual size of beds are $20^{\prime \prime}$ by $14^{\prime \prime}$. Do not overstuff, but remember that these beds lay on metal bars.

## Fons and Porter's Quilt Tips:

- Roll a lint roller over the surface of your cutting mat for a quick clean-up.
- If you are having difficulty seeing clear monofilament thread when threading your needle, run the end of the thread across a permanent marker. This will colour only the end of the thread and make it easier to see to thread the needle.
- to keep track of your quilting needle when you interrupt your quilting, keep a colourful piece of ribbon handy to attach to the spot where you stopped. It is easy to locate when you resume quilting.


## It's a Mystery!

This month we will be making "log cabin" blocks. Everyone will be making 12 of them. They are $101 / 2$ " unfinished.

Foe each block you will need 1 EACH colour 1, colour 2 and background $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, 1 each $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}, 6$ $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangles, 1 each $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ colour 2 rectangles, and $281 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ colour 1 rectangles.

Sew the background square to the colour 1 square. Sew $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangle to the combined squares. Then the $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ colour 2 . Then colour $261 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Then the background $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Sew the colour 2 square to one of the colour $181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles to create a $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Sew the $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ colour 1 rectangle to the block and finally the $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. (The arrows in the diagrams refer to pressing direction.)
