Fons and Porter's Quilt Tips:

- Roll a lint roller over the surface of your cutting mat for a quick clean-up.
- If you are having difficulty seeing clear monofilament thread when threading your needle, run the end of the thread across a permanent marker. This will colour only the end of the thread and make it easier to see to thread the needle.
- to keep track of your quilting needle when you interrupt your quilting, keep a colourful piece of ribbon handy to attach to the spot where you stopped. It is easy to locate when you resume quilting.

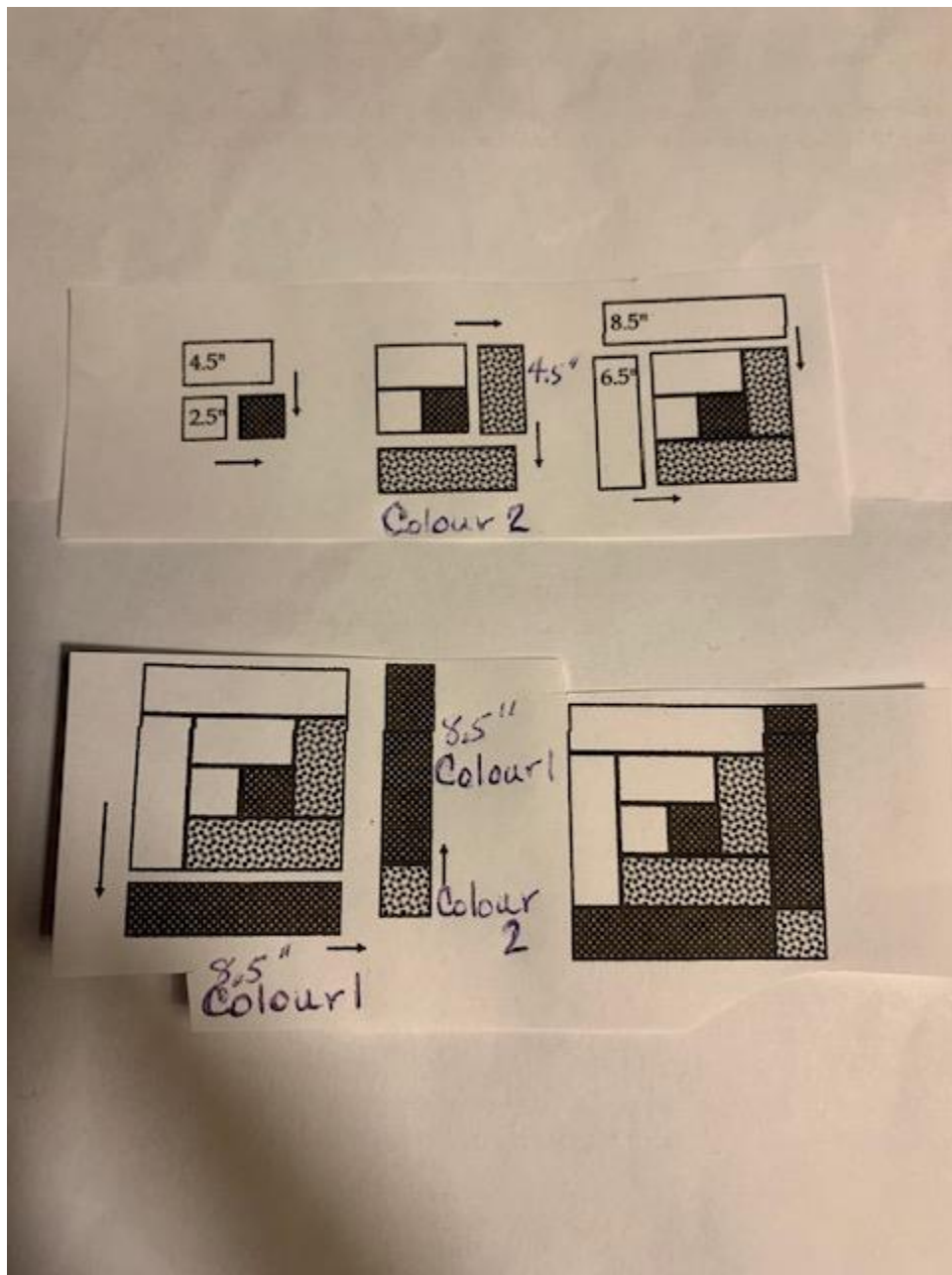
It's a Mystery!

This month we will be making "log cabin" blocks. Everyone will be making 12 of them. They are 10 1/2" unfinished.

For each block you will need 1 EACH colour 1, colour 2 and background 2 1/2" square, 1 each 4 1/2", 6 1/2" and 8 1/2" background rectangles, 1 each 4 1/2" and 6 1/2" colour 2 rectangles, and 2 8 1/2" colour 1 rectangles.

Sew the background square to the colour 1 square. Sew 4 1/2" background rectangle to the combined squares. Then the 4 1/2" colour 2. Then colour 2 6 1/2". Then the background 6 1/2" and 8 1/2" rectangles. Sew the colour 2 square to one of the colour 1 8 1/2" rectangles to create a 10 1/2" rectangle. Sew the 8 1/2" colour 1 rectangle to the block and finally the 10 1/2" rectangle. (The arrows in the diagrams refer to pressing direction.)
