### **WQG Instructors Report**

I have asked Darcy Stewart Hunter to teach her birds on May 30th. At St Gertrudes at 9am to 3pm. Come early to set up. I think we can handle 20 people.

She has 4 birds available a chickadee, cardinal, blue jay, and a hummingbird. The cost is \$25.00, which includes the cost of the class, a pattern and a matting board. Other patterns are available for \$12.00 and the board is \$3.00. I will need your money when you register by the May meeting as I need to let her know how many to plan for and I will have her bring all her patterns with her so that all are available to be purchased by anyone who wants them.

If you are interested in her patterns and do not want to take the course please let me know so that she can bring them for you and prepay for them as well.

Sherida Giddings can be here September 30 a Wednesday to teach the Judy Niemeyer paper piecing workshop. If this is a good date please let me know you want to attend. If it would be better to have it after retreat please let me know that as well, it would be October 5th a Monday.

The Cost of the workshop will be \$25.00 . The Workshop will be at St Gertrudes from 9am to 3pm (come early to set up). I will only be able to take 16 people so it will be a first come with money basis.

She will teach the basics of paper piecing for any Judy N patterns. You will need a 12" add a quarter inch ruler. She will bring them with her if you want to buy them the day of the workshop. She will also bring patterns that you can buy then. Please look then up on the internet for materials needed. The library has some patterns but you will need to buy the papers for the pattern. Sorry to cancel the last SS but with no heat in the hall, it would have been too cold to sew. Hopefully on March 21st the next SS it will be warmer. After all it is Spring soon.

This month we will be doing a Faux Log Cabin Quilt with Judy Boyd

If you do not want to do it scrappy then you will need 1/2 yard red or yellow for centers.

1yard Dark, 1 1/4 yard Dark , 1 1/2 yard

Dark, and 2 yard Dark ( 5 different colors dark) and 4 1/2 yd light. Or you can do it scrappy with many colors.

If you want to cut and sew together the following then you will be ahead to start making the blocks.

Med/Dark sew to Light

2.5 inch X 21 inch to 8.5 inch X 21 this is the centre so red or Yellow for the dark color

4.5 inch X 21 inch to 6.5 inch X 21

6.5 inch X 21 inch to 4.5 inch X 21

8.5 inch X 21 inch to 2.5 inch X 21

10.5 inch X 21 Leave as one piece

Judy will show these pairs at Guild. This is a fun and quick way to make a log cabin quilt.

It is fat quarter friendly. Please sign up and come and enjoy the day. Thank you Janet M

**5"charm swap**

1. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre -washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e. Janet W blue

You may do multiple sets within each section, but each set must be a different fabric.

Only good quality fabric cut accurately.

March - novelty - any color

April - Yellow

May - Purple

June - Orange and returned in September

### **Fons & Porter Tips of the Month:**

- When drawing around templates, place a sheet of fine sandpaper under your fabric to prevent slipping. Secure sandpaper to table top with masking tape.
- attach the loop side of a couple strips of velcro to the bottom of your sewing foot control to help it stay put on a carpeted floor.
