

# <u>5"charm swap</u>

1. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre -washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e. Janet W blue You may do multiple sets within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately.

May - Purple

June - Orange and returned in September

# Community Quilt Report:

Community Quilts:-

This year we have given out 19 quilts - none for this month. That really is not a lot so if anyone needs one please let me know (Kathy Boone).

As you have read there are 10 quilt kits with Trisha Robinson for the Riverside Court Quilters for the next year. They usually do two a month. There seems to be one missing from those done this year. Could the volunteers check to make sure you haven't taken one (#21-23) home & just not finished binding it. You can drop it off at my place anytime. Thanks.

In stock we have a total of 53 quilts - broken down as follows:-

Ladies Quilts - 13; Men's Quilts - 9; Children's - 11; Baby's - 15; Large (Double - Queen) - 5. They are all in bins so storage is no problem. We also have fabric & tops to make more kits/quilts.

Our budget this year was \$600.00 & we only spent \$115.40. We probably spent more but I keep losing slips. Oh, Well. We will need to invest in more material for backings.....if things ever get back to "normal".

As you can see, even if we can't meet this fall, there are still lots of quilts to give out. We are still looking for someone to take on this committee.

I have asked Darcy Stewart Hunter to teach her birds on May 30th. At St Gertrudes at 9am to 3pm. Come early to set up. I think we can handle 20 people. I will need your money when you register by the May meeting as I need to let her know how many to plan for and I will have her bring all her patterns with her so that all are available to be purchased by anyone who wants them.

She has 4 birds available a chickadee, cardinal, blue jay, and a hummingbird. The cost is \$25.00, which includes the cost of the class, a pattern and a matting board. Other patterns are available for \$12.00 and the board is \$3.00.

If you are interested in her patterns and do not want to take the course please let me know so that she can bring them for you and prepay for them as well.

Unknown if this will happen, we are hoping that the virus guidelines allow gatherings of 10 or more.

Sherida Giddings will be here September 30, a Wednesday to teach the Judy Niemeyer paper piecing workshop.

She will teach the basics of paper piecing for any Judy N patterns. You will need a 12" add a quarter inch ruler. She will bring them with her if you want to buy them the day of the workshop. # Fons & Porter Tips of the Month:

- to test to be sure your marking pencil is removable, mark on the selvage of the fabric before your pre-wash. If the mark is gone after washing, you know the pencil **is** safe to use on the fabric.
- to clean permanent marker from the edge of your ruler, use a cotton ball dipped in rubbing alcohol.

To save time when preparing for workshops, make a permanent Class Kit. Put all the basics, essential tools or supplies into it. Just grab the kit when heading out to a workshop.
