LIBRARY COMMITTEE REPORT

Another month has gone and here we are kicking off a new one so here is some Library information for the month of April.

Any Guild lady members who have books signed out can return them to the library before Guild meeting starts.

The library is in desperate need of a new storage cabinet for storing the books, magazines and Quilting tools. The one that we have is badly broken and the shelves are giving away with the weight of the books. Sheena and I have discussed the following possible solutions:

- 1. We need a very solid heavy duty wooden cabinet that will hold plenty of books and will not break. I have one at home that if I can find something to replace mine, my Husband would remodel mine with plywood and reinforce the back and shelves
- **OR** 2. Perhaps a member of the guild has one that they possibly want to give up.....something with 2 solid doors and a bottom drawer would be a better solution for keeping the Quilting supplies separate from the books so these tools don't get damaged.
- **OR** 3. Possibly get someone to build a cabinet made from plywood but also add the bottom drawer in which I have just the right one for that which I will explain more at the meeting.

A new pattern is available in the Library called: The Luxie Bag. I have started working on mine and really not hard to make.

We are looking for a Bargello Quilt book to add to the Library as there are some members are asking for one. We would like to know where we can get one and would appreciate any help from members to obtain such a book.

Trail Mix - Block 3 - Triple Four Patch

To make **ONE** triple four-patch block cut the following: totals in brackets

From assorted prints cut


- 2 (88) 3 1/2" squares
- 4 (176) 2" squares

From medium or dark print cut:


- 1 (44) - 1 1/4"x 12" strip

From a light print cut:


- 1 (44) 1 1/4" x 12" strip
- 1. Aligning long edges, sew together the medium or dark print 1 1/4" x 12" strip and the light print 1 1/4" x 22" strip to make a strip set. Press the seam towards the darker fabric. Sub-cut the strip set into eight 1 1/4" wide segments.




2. Sew together two segments to make a 4 patch. It should measure 2" square. Repeat to make a total of four Four-Patch units



3. Sew together two Four-patch units and two 2" squares in pairs. Note the placement of the light squares. Press. Join the pairs to make a double four-patch unit. Press. This unit will measure 3 1/2". Repeat to make a second double four-patch.



4. Sew together the double four-patch units and the 3 1/2" square. Press towards the charm square. Join two units together to make the triple four-patch. Block measures 6 1/2" and you need t o make a total of 44.

form. Please return to any of the coordinators.



I don't want to let all of the shops know that we're coming and then have to cancel.


