Long Arm Quilt Machine - All guilds in New Brunswick have received a letter in regards Victoria Quilters purchasing one. They have put out a challenge to all guilds to make a donation. We have decided not to donate at this time.

River Valley Cancer Support Group - gives out about approximately 8 bags per month to those in need in our area. If anyone is interested in making a bag there is fabric here at guild. Bags need to be 12x15 inches and lined. If we could have some brought to the December meeting that would help get them through the Holiday Season.

Susan Hayden - Tina Harding called to inquire about a tree skirt. Her group is putting a tree into the living Christmas tree at the Ayr Motor Centre. They would like it to say Strength Experience Hope.

Make I 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"

We are happy to say that we are going to have a great time swapping mug rugs at December's meeting. Please make sure you remember to bring yours and to wrap it please.

We will be giving out the fabric challenge at Dec's meeting. We had 26 people sign up and we did get a little extra so if you did not sign up you can tonight. Please do not show anyone your fabric or your completed item until after the MARCH meeting. If you like the fabric Diane picked it out and if you do not Janet W picked it out. RULES FOR CHALLENGE: Make something, anything. Just

finish it and bring it to the MARCH meeting. We will be awarding prizes based on viewer's choice!!

Lets finish that Mini Block Of The Month

1. Dig out the flying geese you made last month. We will start with the B/G geese that you squared up to  $1.1/2" \times 2.1/2"$ . Sew one on each side of A

(2 1/2" square) paying attention to their orientation. See Pic




6. Sew a unit from step 4 to each end of the remaining units from step 3. Note be aware of the direction the 4 patches are placed. Sew these units to the top and bottom of the unit from step 5. Press



7. Dig out the flying geese you made last month. Sew a unit of D/J to facing sides of each I. Press




8. Sew a E to each end of the remaining D/J units. Press. Sew these two units to the top and bottom of each unit from the last step.





9. Sew a unit L/K unit from last month to facing sides of the unit from step 6. Press




end of an F. Sew slightly to the outside of the drawn line. Cut corner off leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press




11. Sew the unit from the last step on to the top and bottom of step


10. Sew a unit from step 8 to each end of the remaining units. Press



4. Sew a C and an H together. Press. Sew two C/H units together turning one 180 degrees. Press



9. Press. You are done. Confirm it is square, layer and quilt. Please bring to guild when finished.



5. Sew a unit from step 3 to facing sides of the unit of step 2. Press


# The "NECESSARY" Clutch Wallet SUPER SATURDAY JANUARY 16, 2016

# Supply list:

4 fat quarters of co-ordinating fabrics. You may be creative here: you could use 2 of one fabric and 2 of another. As long as you have 4 in total.

Thread to co-ordinate

- 1/3 yard of fusible fleece
- 1 nylon zípper to co-ordínate (at least 10" long)



Prices are in US Funds

1 Twist Lock 3.95

Pattern for "The NECESSARY Clutch" 9.00

(2) hooks and (2) Drings 4.60

2 yards of Pellon #101 Fusible Light Interfacing

6 x 9 scrap of Pellon Peltex Ultra Form Stabilizer

(Maybe 1 yard of this could be shared by several people)





per yard 5.00 per yard 9.00

In addition to your regular sewing kit and machine, bring a heavy jeans or topstitch needle. If you have some 1/8 "double faced basting tape, it is helpful (but not necessary) for zipper placement. If you have a glue stick bring it along too. Don't buy one- we do have some to share.

Super Saturday starts at 8:30 am as this is a full day project! Please cut out your pieces and label them prior to Super Saturday! Betty is a pro at this project and has oodles of wonderful helpful hints to make this wallet spectacular!!!



- 2. Woven Quilts "Something to Crow About"


Each of these can be mostly completed in a day and they both have some new techniques which have not been offered before.
