Super Saturday November 16th

This month we are doing Crystal Brown' quilt called Party Hat Quilt.

You may make it as big as you want, Crystal's was a queen size and requires 4.5 Yards background (hers was white) and charm squares in dark or medium. You may also need 5.25 inch squares for the pattern. This can be a scrap quilt to use up some of your fabric.

Class starts at 9:00 am Doors open at 8:20. Any questions please call Janet M or Crystal Brown. Sign up sheet will be at the front table when you come in. Thank you Janet M

5"charm swap

1. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all salvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e Janet W blue
You may do multiple sets within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately.

Nov - green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks

Dec - red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks
Jan - gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks
Feb - Anything goes, any color
March - novelty - any color
