Program - Block of the Month - We will have this completed just after Christmas. The key to this BOM is accuracy. This month we will cut our fabric. The background is all one color. Therefore the 5 fabrics. We are steering away from the pattern slightly with only having one background fabric. In the picture the lightest is the background.

Mug Rugs - It is bigger than a coaster and smaller than a placemat. At Christmas we wanted to do something fun. At our potluck we would like to have a mug rug exchange. Please sign up if you are interested.

Zentangles - it is basically doodling. It is nothing really new. Monks make mandalas in the sand. This form of doodling was developed by Rick Roberts & Maria Thomas. A reference book is Zen Quilting by Pat Ferguson. You can find patterns on the internet by googling Zentangles.

Lets get this show on the road!!


Mini Block of the month

Block assembly:

1. Draw a line through all of the B's (or use the angler). Draw a 1/4" line on each side of the center line. Lay two B's in facing corners of a G (the B's will over lap). Sew slightly to the center of the 1/4" line on each side and cut on the center line. Press B's away from G. Lay a B in the corer of D. Sew slightly to the center of the 1/4" line and cut on the center

line. Press B's away from G. SEE DIAGRAM

- 2. Accuracy is a must. Please confirm they are the correct size (1 1/2" x 2 1/2"0 and square up if need be
- 3. We may as well keep going. Using the above method, do the same for:
- A. Make four L/K (4 1/2" x 8 1/2")
- B. Make sixteen D/J (1 1/2" x 2 1/2")



MUG RUG SWAP

All participants now have the name of who they are swapping with. Please bring wrapped mug rug with you to the December meeting where we will swap them. If you are unable to make the meeting, please make sure they are given to Janet Wright before the meeting.

UP FOR A CHALLENGE???????????????????????

Program has decided to do a fabric challenge. What is involved??

Sign up is tonight so we know how may wish to take part and so we know how much fabric to buy.

Next month each member will be given a brown bag with a piece of fabric in it. All the fabrics will be the same. You are to keep the fabric hidden away (don't show others the fabric or what you make!). Go home and make something out of that fabric.

You can make anything (mug rug, wall hanging, pin cushion, quilt, cover a book, etc...) but that fabric MUST be used in what you make. You may use other fabrics as well. This challenge will be passed in in March, with your name hidden on the article. We will display them and let the members vote on their favorites. Prizes will be given out.

Super Saturday

Supply List for November 21, 2015

Betty and I will be teaching three projects- all Christmas tree themed.

We will have finished samples for your viewing on Monday night. All three are great stash busters too! Might I suggest you bring along some of your Christmas stash... you might want to do some trading/sharing! Bring along some regular reds, greens, light tone on tones too- you don't want a fabric emergency J!!!!

You will need your machine of course, regular sewing kit, mat, cutter threads, etc etc.

THE TALLEST TREE 16 1/4" x 37 5/8"

- 1 Charm pack (or 1/6 yd each of <u>assorted</u> off white, green, gold, blue fabrics- or your own assorted 5×5 squares)
- 2/3 yard backing
- 2/3 yard of batting or fusible fleece
- 1/4 yard binding
- (5) red buttons ranging in size from 3/4 -1 1/4 inches (or all the same size!)



PIECE TREE 12" x 24"

3/4 yard light tan print (or tone on tone)

3/8 yard of assorted green OR assorted red prints (or you can bring (19) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ "x 11" strips)

small scrap of brown print (2 x 2 square)

- 14 x 26 batting or fusible fleece
- 12×24 artist canvas (can buy this at Michaels they cost 14.99 for 2...share with someone and use a coupon to get it for even less!)
- a staple gun and staples if you have one...we will bring ours so please don't buy one!



WINTER WONDERLAND 18 ½" x 37"

- ½ yard total of assorted light prints for blocks
- 2/3 yard of assorted medium and dark prints for blocks (or a charm pack works well!)
- 3/8 yard cream print for tree rows
- ½ yard total assorted green prints for tree rows
- (8) 1 x 1 1/4 rectangles of dark brown for tree trunks
- 1/3 yard of red print for sashing and border
- 1/3 yard green for binding (pattern uses a small stripe- nice but any green will do)
- 1 1/4 yards backing
- 25 x 43 batting or fusible fleece





Each of these can be mostly completed in a day and they both have some new techniques which have not been offered before.


Other quilters were researched but for various reasons will not work at this time. We will explain at the meeting.

A Recipe from Joan Prosser

We had this at our last Super Saturday, so I managed to coerce Joan to give us her recipe....

Katherine's Squares

1/2 cup dates, chopped

1 cup boiling water

Cook dates until soft. Do not drain water but then add the following to the pot....

1 Tbsp. butter

3/4 cup brown sugar

1 Egg

1/2 cup chopped maraschino cherries

3/4 cup flour

1/2 tsp baking soda

3/4 tsp baking powder

Mix together until all dry ingredients are wet.

Pour into a lightly greased square pan and bake at 350 F. for 25 minutes.

Cool and frost as desired.
