

<u>Instructor's Report:</u>

We had a great time with Paul Leger this summer and I have another instructor planned for September 14 during Super Saturday.

We have Bev Day coming with her Nutcracker, it can be done as a wall hanging or a table runner. (I will have the table runner requirements at our meeting Sept 9)

Cost is \$15.00 (includes the Super Saturday fee)

Nutcracker Supply List:

Raw edge appliqué looks difficult, but it is easy and fun to do. You can use the decorative stitches on your machine to create your pieces.

This class will start off going through various raw edge stitches and how to finish those

Odd shapes that provide the finishing touches and take your raw edge appliqué from ho hum to great.

Then we will start the nutcracker hitch you can make as a table runner or wall hanging.

We will talk about quilting, binding and embellishing your nutcracker.

Here is the supply list to do a wall hanging.

Background 11 x 18

1st border 2 strips. 1 1/2 x WOF

2nd border 2 strips. $2 \frac{1}{2} \times WOF$

Binding. 2 strips of 2nd border 2 $1/4 \times WOF$

Nutcracker

White - beard, hair, teeth mustache, eyes, eyebrows -5×7

Tan - face and hands - 3x 5

Black - eyes, shoes, stockings, pants, teeth unit, belt 5×10

Red - lip, nose 3×2

Decorate fabric - jacket and hat. 10×5

Heat and bond 1/2 meter

3 - 12 x 12 quilt sandwiches made out of scrapes or muslin
 6 - 5 inch squares of fabric (scrapes)
 Sewing machine clean, new needle ready to go
 Scissors, cutting mat, rotary cutter, pencil
 Threads to match with fabric
 Light board if you have one

<u>Nutcracker Table runner - Super Saturday, Sept. 14th, 2019, Saint</u> Gertrude's church Hall

Background 11 \times 44 you could add an addition piece to the center 11 \times 18

1st border 5 strips. 1 1/2 x WOF

2nd border 5 strips. 2 $1/2 \times WOF$

Binding. 5 strips of 2nd border 2 $1/4 \times WOF$

Nutcracker

White - beard, hair, teeth mustache, eyes, eyebrows -5×14

Tan - face and hands - 3x 10

Black - eyes, shoes, stockings, pants, teeth unit, belt 5×20

Red - lip, nose 3×4

Decorate fabric - jacket and hat. 10×10

Heat and bond 1 meter

Sewing machine clean, new needle ready to go

Scissors, cutting mat, rotary cutter, pencil

Threads to match with fabric

Light board if you have one

- 3 12 \times 12 quilt sandwiches made out of scrapes or muslin
- 6 5 inch squares of fabric (scrapes)

5<u>" charm swap</u>

1. Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all salvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue

You may do multiple sets within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately.

Sept - pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks
Oct - pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only
Nov - green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks
Dec - red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks
Jan - gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks
Feb - Anything goes, any color
March - novelty - any color
