## Program:

## Mystery Quilt: Conclusion

Cut $41 / 2$ "squares of one fabric or variety of fabric of same tone.
You will need 40 squares for table /Wall size
54 squares for lap size
84 squares for twin size
You are the designer!
Sew alternating pieced and square blocks (above) or create a unique pattern or color combination with your blocks. Add more if you wish.

The wall/table size will be 9 blocks $\times 9$ blocks
Lap: 9 blocks $\times 12$ blocks
Twin: 13 blocks $\times 13$ blocks

Add borders if you desire.
