

Sew together 4-half square triangles to create a pinwheel block.


Square up to 4 1/2"

## Home Challenge

What seems like a decade ago, I issued a challenge called <u>HOME</u>. Make anything that reminds you of "HOME". We did have half a dozen people participate.

Our quilt show is now being planned and the theme is <u>HOME</u> (surprise surprise!!) So the Home display at the quilt show is going to be very very small. So to try to rectify that, I am issuing another HOME challenge and calling it X2 LOL. <u>CHALLENGE</u> : Make anything quilty that reminds you of home. Have the item completely finished for the February meeting. They will be put on display at the meeting and members will vote on them. Prizes will be awarded Previous HOME items can not be re-submitted.

#### 5" charm swap

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all salvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue

You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

#### Dec – Purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks

Jan- pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks Feb - pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only March - green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks April - red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks May - gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks June - Anything goes, any color (good way to dump the ones you didn't like) Janet W swap hostess
