## Quilting at Riverside, February 2021

Until further notice, there will not be any quilting sessions with the Seniors. We are waiting for the go-ahead from Riverside and hope that this will change soon. Thank you for your understanding.

## Cat Beds:

We are looking for someone to continue this project. There may be issues with Dunroamin, in that do they even want cat beds. So, could someone please take this on to find out if the shelters want the cat beds, and, if they do, coordinate the creation, collection and delivery of them. Actual size of beds are $20^{\prime \prime}$ by 14 ". Do not overstuff, but remember that these beds lay on metal bars.

## It's a Mystery!

So, this is turning out to be more difficult than I thought (the write-up), but here it goes.

Block 1 - the "flower" block.
Small and medium will make 16, large will make 20.
For each block you will need $7-21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background squares, $1-61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $1-81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background rectangles. 1 EACH 2 1/2', 4 1/2" colour 1.1 EACH 4 1/2', 6 1/2', 8 1/2" and 10 1/2" rectangle colour 2.

On the wrong side of every background $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square draw a diagonal line corner to corner. This will be your sewing line. If you are thrifty, like me, draw a second line $1 / 2$ " away for a second sewing line. We will be using the stitch and flip method with these squares.

Place one background square with the colour 1 square and sew on the line. If you are doing the thrifty thing, sew the second line also. Cut $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the one sewing line, or in the middle of the two lines to have the piece for the block and a spare half square triangle to be used in another project. Press to the dark side, or press the seam open, whichever is your preference.

Place another background triangle on the $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ colour 1 so that when sewn it becomes the top right corner when stitched and flipped.

Repeat with the colour 2 rectangles, top left on the $41 / 2^{\prime}$ and $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and the top right on the $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.

At this point you should have 6 pieces that have bee stitched and flipped, and a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background pieces left.

Sew as follows, making 16 for small and medium, 20 for large quilt. See photo next page
