It would also be beneficial to have half square triangles (finishing at 2 ½”) on a roll or Thangles.

Fabric Requirements:

4 ½ yards of background

1 ½ yards of contrasting fabric (contrast to background and strips)

40 2 ½” strips width of fabric (should have some color variations)

¾ yard for binding (should match contrasting fabric)

This beauty will finish out around 85” x 75”

Program, Block of the Month Project:

WQG 2022 True Blue Block of the Month featuring Riley Blake’s Confetti Cotton Solids

As part of Program for the 2022-2023 guild season, Janet has asked each of the local quilt shops to participate in some way. I was asked to organize a Block of the Month. I hope you enjoy the process of constructing this quilt top with friends and love the finished product as much as I do! Please see details below:

True Blue Block of the Month Quilt - Finished size: Approx 70 x 90”

September 2022- April 2023, there will be two block patterns released per month in the newsletter and posted to the guild Facebook page. During the months of May-June 2023, a bonus block and the setting block/finishing instructions (including an alternative setting) will be released in the same manner. Each month, video tutorials will also be posted to the guild Facebook page.

Fabric requirements:

1 yard Bleached Denim

1.25 yards Cadet

1.5 yards Cornflower

1.5 yards Oxford

2 yards Pebble (includes binding)

6.75 yards Cloud

Backing (approx.): 5.5 yards of 43” wide OR 2.25 yards of 108” wide

Riley Blake Confetti Cotton Solid Kits, including 14 yards of fabric, are available for purchase from Buttermilk Creek Quilts for \$165 + tax. The kit includes all fabric required for construction of the quilt top and binding, as well as printed patterns for all 17 blocks and the finishing/setting instructions.

I am pleased to offer the premium solids for this project at just \$11.50/yard. If you’ve never used Riley Blake fabric before, it’s lovely to work with and the quality is top-notch! I would also be more than happy to assist anyone who would like to hand-select fabrics for this project, perhaps in batiks or an alternative colour way. Of course, you are also welcome to use fabrics from your stash. Retreat Report:

Due to the cancellation of our fall retreat, we held our retreat in the spring at the Villa Madonna. 23 people attended the retreat from June 9th - 12th. We had a great time playing the dice game with 3 winners of fat quarters. We had sent everyone a piece of fabric to make something. We voted on our favorites with three prizes given out. Then we auctioned off the products and raised \$642.00 and donated it to the villa. We also donated \$410.00 to the kitchen staff for a tip. The Villa was paid \$6622.00 for the retreaters.

We are now planning our fall retreat. We arrive Oct 6th, Thursday morning after 9 am. We leave Sunday after lunch. Please note Thanksgiving is Monday. The price for the retreat itself will now be \$335.00 for the entire time. Sherida Giddings, certified Quiltworx Judy Niemeyer instructor is attending the entire time. Her fee will be about \$40 per retreator, possible less for guild members going. We are doing another fabric challenge as well as we will be playing the dice game for FQ's. We currently have 15 people signed up to go. We can have 42 max. WQG members are priority for sign up and if there is more room, non-members can come. I currently have a waiting list for non-members. website. We arrive Thursday morning after 9 am. We leave Sunday after lunch. Please note Thanksgiving is Monday.

Sherida Giddings, is a certified Quiltworx Judy Niemeyer teacher from Ottawa. She will be at the retreat the entire time. She will be doing demos all weekend on different paper piecing techniques and can help with any Quiltworx project. If you need a project, you can contact her as well (sherida_giddings@yahoo.ca).

We feel this retreat is going to fill up fast. We have room for 42. We currently have 15 signed up to go. We have opened the retreat up to guild members and then others if room. We will have a cancellation list. So, if you wish to go, please let me know asap (wsnapo@hotmail.com). You all have a couple weeks to get signed up before we open it up to non-guild members.

I have been going to retreat at the Villa for around 15 years for the same price. They have now decided to adjust their prices. The price for the retreat itself will now be \$335.00 for the entire time. That is a ten dollar a day raise (and about time I say).

Each retreator will be chipping in to pay for our teacher. The cost will be around \$40 for the entire time. The guild has proposed giving the retreat some funds. If that is approved by membership, Woodstock Quilt Guild members will receive a reduction on the teacher cost. Both costs will be collected at the retreat in cash.

We are also doing a fabric challenge. Please see Diane at the meeting and she will give you a piece of fabric. You may add anything else to this fabric and make something, anything. We will be doing a silent auction during the retreat. The funds raised will be donated to the Villa. We raised over \$600 at the last retreat.

5" Charm Swap

PLEASE, I NEED MORE PARTICIPANTS.

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a zip-loc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

Sept – pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only

Oct – green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks

Nov – red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks

Dec – gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks
