## Material list and Cutting for Notions Bag - Instructor, Christine Corey

- Interfacing for lining and exterior- Approx $11 / 2$ yards of Pellon SF101- Shape flex
- 1-22" or longer all-purpose zipper for outside zip
- 4-12" or longer zippers for inside pockets
- Thread to match or coordinate with fabric for topstitching

Cutting for bag: Outside of bag (approx. $1 / 2$ yard) $1-\mathrm{A}-10 \times 16^{1 / 2}$

- $2-L-1 \frac{3}{4} \times 3$-zipper tabs
- $2-J-21 / 4 \times 18$ side bindings
- $2-K-21 / 4 \times 24$ outside zipper binding
- 2-I-pattern piece cut with wrong sides together( to make 1 of pattern and 1 in reverse)

Inside between pockets: Will take 2-10" strips width of fabric

- 3-B-E-F- $10 \times 101 / 2$
- 1 -C- $10 \times 7 \frac{1}{2}$
- 1 -D- $10 \times 93 / 4$
- 2-I- with fabric wrong sides together

Inside of pockets: Will take 1-10" strip

- $2-\mathrm{G}-10 \times 3$ ¹/2
- $6-\mathrm{H}-10 \times 41 / 2$


## From Interfacing:

- $1-\mathrm{A}-91 / 4 \times 161 / 4$
- $3-B-E-F-93 / 4 \times 93 / 4$
- $1-\mathrm{C}-93 / 4 \times 93 / 4$
- $1-D-93 / 4 \times 91 / 2$
- 2-I-with fusing sides together


## Pre-class Instructions and Tools Needed

- Cut and fuse all pieces-I will bring copies of pattern with me to April meeting
- Label with 10 " side indicated as being sideways
- Usual sewing supplies including
- Sewing machine- with foot control and power cord
- Fabric marker-not heat erasable-I use regular quilting pencil
- Seam ripper
- Ruler ( $41 / 2 \times 121 / 2$ is large enough) rotary cutter and mat
- Zipper foot and walking foot might be necessary depending on how well your machine likes/dislikes thick seams
- Sewing pins and wonder clips

It would be helpful to have your own pressing area as there is a lot of pressing for the zipper stage.

From your background fabric cut $3581 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashings
Follow the picture joining 6 stars and 5 of your sashings to make 7 rows. Alternate a star row with a 4 patch row. Your completed quilt will measure $88^{\prime \prime} \times 76^{\prime \prime}$. This is a Missouri Star pattern. Key word STAR PATCH

## 5" Charm Swap

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one $5^{\prime \prime}$ strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5 " squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a zip-loc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e. Janet W blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

- April - orange - all over color is orange, prints allowed, lights to darks
- May -pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks
- June - purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks
