Super Saturday - March 18th: Modern Crazy Quilt

I would love to have you join me for Super Saturday on March 18th. We'll be making a Modern Crazy Quilt! All the details are below. Please reach out with any questions by phone at (506) 392-0912 or by email at kjdavis@live.ca

Modern Crazy Quilt Dimensions:

Without Optional Borders: 48.5 x 56.5" With Optional Borders: 59.5 x 67.5"

Supplies List:

- 1 42-piece layer cake or package of 10" squares (We have some pretty options at Buttermilk Creek Quilts if you are in need. For this project, it's best to choose one with lots of fabrics, and minimal repeats.)
- 3 additional coordinating 10" squares
- 10 Crazy Quilt Papers (at a cost of \$2.95 (\$2.56 + tax while supplies last)
- Binding: 1/2 yd coordinating fabric* (allows for 2.5" strips cut on the straight of grain)
- coordinating thread

Optional Supplies for Borders (if desired):

- 1/3 yd coordinating fabric for 1" finished inner border (6 1.5" strips)
- 1 yd coordinating fabric for 4.5" finished outer border (6-7 5" strips)

*You will need the full 1/2 yd of fabric for binding if you are adding the optional borders, so you may wish to purchase a bit more to be safe.

Tools List:

- a rotary cutter (a fresh blade would be useful as we will be cutting through 5 layers of fabric at a time)
- small-medium cutting mat (at least 12" square; a rotating mat would be helpful if you have one)
- medium acrylic ruler (at least 12" long. If you have an 8.5" square ruler, it would also be helpful, but it's not necessary.)
- pencil
- sewing machine
- iron/board
- typical sewing tools: snips, pins, seam ripper, etc.

What do you need to prepare in advance of our class?

- Select your layer cake, and border and binding fabrics- what fun!
- Organize your 10" squares into groups of 5 coordinating fabrics.
- OPTIONAL: Cut your border strips if you are adding them.

I look forward to sewing with you on March 18th! I know you'll love this easy technique and the vintage aesthetic of the finished product (photos attached).

February 18th, Super Saturday – Selvage tutorial, lead by Trisha Robinson

We will be focusing on making a Selvage Zipper Pouch, 10" x 8"

Materials needed --- lots and lots of selvages (preferably $\frac{3}{4}$ to 1" wide and of varying lengths). There will be some to share if you don't have many. Two pieces of batting (20/80 Hobbs for example) at least 11" x 10" each. Two pieces of cotton 10" x 9" for lining. 12" zipper or longer. Co-ordinating thread although I used white because most selvages are white.

Sun, Sand, and Sea CQA/ACC MEMBER GUILD QUILT CHALLENGE 2023

- Please choose fabric colours (plain or patterned) that include Yellow, Blue, and Sand (i.e. taupe, beige or even coral) on the front of the quilt.
- The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72 inches. THATS ALL THE WAY AROUND
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings, or enveloped pillow-case style.
- There must be a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purposes.
- All quilts must have a label on the back with the quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.

 Item is to be finished and brought to the March 2024 meeting. We will vote and send only one.
- All quilts must be physically received by May 30, 2023 so they can be displayed at the Halifax Convention Centre, June 8-10, 2023.
- The winning quilt will be selected by Viewers' Choice during Quilt Canada 2023 and awarded a \$100 cash prize.

Note: Your submitted piece may be kept for a year to be part of a CQA/ACC touring trunk show to promote Quilt Canada 2024 in Edmonton, Alberta.

Hello to one and all. In honour of the Guild's 25h Anniversary in 2024, I would like to issue a challenge. In keeping with the 25th Anniversary Theme

- The piece must be finished and bound. With overall dimensions of 25x25" but not larger than 30x30"
- The piece must include the colour, silver. Examples: Silver fabric, lace, ribbon, beads or buttons.
- To honour our Guild Patch, it should include a 9-patch block or could be a 9-patch block. Examples of 9 Patch Blocks

5" Charm Swap

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a zip-loc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

Feb - white - all over color is white, prints allowed, lights to darks

March - black - all over color is black, prints allowed, lights to darks

April - orange - all over color is orange, prints allowed, lights to darks

May -pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks

June - purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks
