Woodstock Quilt Guild Minutes - May 1, 2023

Janet Melanson called the meeting to order at 7:00 with a welcome to guest Lynn Allison.

Correspondence - A thank you card from the NICU in Fredericton for the donation of quilts for new born babies. They are most appreciated and because they always need more, they will still happily accept donations. The dimensions for the tiny quilts are18 x 22 inches, made with flannel preferably or good quality cotton and batting.

Approval of Agenda as published in the Newsletter - Motion made by Diane Scott, seconded by Janet Wright, motion carried.

Approval of Minutes as published in the Newsletter - motion made by Kathy Boone, seconded by Judy Boyd, motion carried.

Business arising from the minutes - Request made by Susan Hayden and Linda Mcaffee in regards to the quality of the comfort quilts. Susan Hayden presented the idea of buying better fabrics for the comfort quilts and Linda Mcaffee made a motion to increase the budget from \$600 to \$1200. A lively discussion was held with Susan Smith, in charge of community quilts, acknowledging the gracious donations of fabric and batting she has received. She felt it is best to continue to incorporate the donations with the new fabric. With more discussion Linda McAffee amended her motion to increase the budget for the coming year from the current amount to \$800. A vote was held and the motion passed.

Approval of Treasurer's Report - In Ellen Armours absence Janet Wright made the motion to approve the report, seconded by Diane Scott, motion carried.

New Business - Trisha Robinson chaired the nominating committee for the executive positions for the coming year. Although all the current executive agreed to stay on it was still required to ask for any other nominations from the floor. As there were none the current executive will carry on for next year. They are as follows:

Community Quilts - Susan Smith stated that as we have 19 baby quilts on hand she would like to donate 9 to the Upper River Valley Hospital Maternity Ward. A vote was held and approved.

Seniors Quilting - Trisha Robinson has four more sessions until the end of the year. She needs volunteers for the May 16, 30 and June 13 sessions.

Library - Colleen McKee had one new book "The Seedling Quilts" ready to lend. Expect some book sales in the fall as she makes room for more new books.

Retreat - Kim Reeleder reported that as Villa Madonna is under new management there will be a few changes such as a slight increase in cost and only one sewing room will be available as well as the board room. Emails will be sent out possibly before June with all changes and plans to the past attendees and then open to the rest of membership.

5" Charm Swap - Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a zip-loc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e. Janet W blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

• June - purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks
