## Super Saturday Annual Report

Nancy London started the year out as chairperson. September class was cancelled due to lack of interest. In October she held a class on wheelchair quilts and neonatal quilts. I took over. We had 15 people attend the Stack and Whack class hosted by Janet Melanson on November19th.. There was not enough interest for the paint brush art class for January. February's class on salvages was cancelled that day due to weather.

I took over with a balance of $\$ 31.20$. I repaid the guild the $\$ 10$ loan for rent. I collected $\$ 150.00$ at the stack and whack class and paid the rent of $\$ 75.00$. Current balance was $\$ 96.20$

## Program, Block of the Month Project:

May Block (Month 9): 2022-23 WQG 'True Blue’ Block of the Month

Wind Spinner by Krystyn Davis, Buttermilk Creek Quilts: Word doc pattern attached.

## Wind Spinner Block

by Buttermilk Creek Quilts

Finished Dimensions: 10 " square

## Cutting instructions:

Oxford four 3 " squares (A)
Cornflower four $3 \times 5.5$ " rectangles (B)
Cadet four $3 \times 5.5$ " rectangles (C)
Cloud eight 3 " squares (D)


Block construction:

1. Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the wrong side of your $A$ and $D$ squares.
2. Using your C rectangles and your D squares, construct 4 traditional flying geese units. Use the stitch and flip method, stitching directly on the diagonal lines you drew. Press seam allowances toward the $D$ fabric. Trim seam allowance on stitch and flipped units to $1 / 4$ ".

3. Using your B rectangles and your A squares, construct 4 units that look like the image below. Use the stitch and flip method, stitching directly on the diagonal lines you drew. Press seam allowance toward the A fabric. Trim seam allowance on the stitch and flipped units to $1 / 4 \prime$.
4. Each of the 4 quadrants of the Wind Snipper block are identical. Construct each by stitching the units made in steps 2 and 3 together as shown in the image below. Press seam allowance toward the partial flying geese unit you made in step 3.

5. Complete block by orienting 4 quadrants as shown in full block image at top of page 1. Stitch quadrants together, alternating the pressing of your seam allowances.

Please bring your completed April blocks to our May meeting. Doing so will earn you entries toward our participation giveaway! A winner will be drawn at our June meeting, so be sure to be in attendance. Prize donated by Buttermilk Creek Quilts.

Additionally, two options for setting our 'True Blue' blocks will be shown at the June meeting: the original designed by Riley Blake, and an alternate setting that I put together.

## 5" Charm Swap

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all selvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a zip-loc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. i.e. Janet $W$ blue. You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must
be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

- May -pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks
- June - purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks
