President's Quilt- Janet Wright

Janet has challenged the members to make the quilt she showed at the meeting. It will be a Block of the Month. The first month will include fabric requirements and instructions for the center medallion. Finished size is $80^{\circ} \times 80^{\circ}$. The center medallion and first blocks are on the website.

Program- Jolene

The fat quarter draw theme for October was orange. It was well supported with 30 fat quarters. There were 6 winners: Shari Gillis, Marilyn Scachfield, Colleen McKee, Sue Hayden, Gail Lawrence, and Donna Lawrence. The November theme is Christmas trees.

There was a showing of the Nine Patch challenge.

As outlined in the newsletter, Jolene is challenging members to quilt outside their comfort zones by trying modern quilts. This months theme is the Ribbon Star. To assist, she handed out a cheat sheet for half square triangles and the ribbon star setting. She also demonstrated how "Thangles" can be used to make half square triangles. Jolene also showed many examples of modern stars made using half square triangles.

A new challenge was issued: create a modern piece, minimum size 12" x 12", finished and due at the February meeting. The challenge is to use the first letter of your first name as the color (S- sage, sandalwood, scarlet, soft white, sea foam green, simply black, etc.). The first letter of your middle name is the name of the quilt pattern (A- a flock of birds, a log cabin, a basket, etc.). The first letter of your last name is the style of quilting used (C- curved lines, circles, columns, cross hatching, etc.). Have fun and let your creative juices flow!

Mystery Quilt: Using WOF, Thangles, or any other method, make 140 half square triangles from your dark and light fabrics. HST should be trimmed to 3" so they will finish at 2 1/2".

MATERIALS

- · 6" square red tonal*
- 5 coordinating holiday print and tonal fat quarters for fabrics 2, 3, 7, 8 and 9*
- · 1 fat quarter green tonal*
- ¾ yard each 3 black coordinating holiday prints for fabrics 1, 5 and 6*
- ¾ yard red/cream print for fabric 4*
- · ½ yard black solid
- 5% yard cream tonal*
- Backing to size
- Batting to size*
- Batting scraps for magnolia pieces
- Thread
- Template material
- Basic sewing tools and supplies

*Magnolia Metallics fabric collection from Moda; Heirloom Cotton batting from Hobbs used to make sample.


INITIAL CHALLENGE:

How are you coming on your Initial Challenge? These are due in February and must be minimum of 12x12" completed. I cannot wait to see all of the fun things you will come up with!

Over the past couple of months we have touched upon Modern Quilting. How we can use traditional quilt patterns and give it a modern look with color placement and use of quilting motifs along with negative space.


This Month we will discuss Log Cabin. What is Log Cabin?

A log cabin block traditionally has a center square which is red to signify the "Hearth". Strips of fabric are then placed around the center square in much the same way you would arrange logs for an actual cabin. Working clockwise stacking each "wall" one at a time. Often your fabric was divided in lights and darks to build your cabin therefore creating your color variance as you build.

MYSTERY QUILT:

Please see instructions for your remaining HST. I promise these are the last of them...

Next month we will begin to sew units together. Umm whatever will it look like?

There has been some confusion around the HST size.

Pattern states: The size of your blocks should be 3" x 3" (finished 2½" x 2½").

Above is one Half Square Triangle. It has been ironed and you have "squared up" the block. It is now 3"x3". This 3"x3" HST includes your seam allowance of $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Imagine a dotted line $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge of each of the four sides of the HST. This is your seam allowance. Once you piece this into a block or the quilt top you will have a 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " "finished" HST.

The link for the HST tutorial I handed out is on the website. Please do not be discouraged. If you have a question or feel that you need assistance. If you feel you have cut your HST the wrong size it is ok. We can amend the pattern to work for you.

Unit 1B - Medium/Light Half Square Triangles (72)



- 1. Cut (2) 8" strips from both the medium and light fabrics.
- 2. Draw your lines, sew on the diagonals, cut, press, and square up as you did for Unit 1A.

Unit 1C - Dark/Medium Half Square Triangles (72)



- 3. Cut (2) 8" strips from both the dark and medium fabrics.
- 4. Draw your lines, sew on the diagonals, cut, press, and square up as you did for Unit 1A.
