

Sandra Culberson

Sandra announced that on November 13th there would be a "wool day" at the Meductic School from 9 to 3. Activities will be rug hooking, needle punch, wool appliqué, etc. The cost is \$5. Bring a bag lunch. There will be no teaching, but folks may find help from other

participants. Also bring any show and tell items that you have. Please see her if you are interested.

Shirley Dunphy

Linda Markey, Cancer Support group bags

The group needs about 120 bags each year. Currently we have 40 already made. There are kits available at the back of the room, or you are welcome to use your own fabric. They are to be 12 1/2" by 15 1/2" and should be lined.

Kathy Boone, hostel for cancer patients at the Saint John Regional Hospital

Anyone who needs daily treatment as an outpatient can stay at the hostel. They need quilts for their beds. The quilts will stay on the beds and must be quilted, not tied. Nadine will take 2 down to Saint John. Anyone interested in making one, it should be at least 50" by 70".

CQA

We belong to the Canadian Quilting Association. They send us stuff and we can send in Guild updates. Sandy Corey volunteered to be the CQA chair. As a reminder, they are having a challenge using the Pantone or Kona color of the year. The quilt will have a maximum perimeter of 72" (I.e. 18" x 18"), use only a maximum of 2 additional colors, have a sleeve, and be with them for 11 months. Members who would like to challenge for our entry need their project completed for the April meeting. Members will vote for their favourite. Janet Wright will email the details. Kathy Boone noted that the quilt shop in Fredericton is trying to find this fabric. Also members can check out Mrs. Pugsley's in Amherst N.S.

Super Saturday, Betty Doherty and Sue Hayden

The October Super Saturday is a quilted rug made from a jelly roll. One jelly roll, sewn end to end seams open, the same length of quilt batting cut 2 1/4" wide (great way to use up all those bits and pieces), jeans needles, and lots and lots of thread are required. An extension table (or craft boxes) are helpful to support the rug and keep it level. Accordion pleat your joined jelly roll as it will rest on your lap.

Quilt Show, Betty Doherty and Sue Hayden

Set up will be on May 2nd with the show on May 3rd and 4th. The theme is Pieces of Time. There will be a section for items from each year of the guild. The committees are up and running. Volunteer signups will be in the new year, as well as the raffle tickets for the raffle quilt will be available at the November meeting. We are having more racks made for the show. There should be twice as many as in 2017.

Riverside Quilting, Trish Robinson

Quilt completed at Riverside two weeks ago was shown. Please see Trish to sign up as she needs 4-6 volunteers each time. The residents at Riverside both appreciate and benefit from this initiative. Set up is at noon, and tea and cookies are at 2:00 pm. If you are free on a Tuesday afternoon please consider volunteering.

Retreat, Janet Wright and Diane Scott

Less than 20 days until the retreat. 43 people have so far signed up! Anyone who has a table with folding legs, could they bring them. There is a fabric challenge, the fabric was handed out, or will be mailed out to not at the meeting attendees. You will be keeping the item, and there will be a prize for the favourite. Ellen spoke about the upcoming workshop using the pattern Sunset Sky. The class was so popular that there will be two back to back workshops - Friday, Nov. 30, and Saturday Dec. 1. There are still a few spots available. The cost is \$25 and must be paid to secure your spot. Ellen will bulk order the patterns (\$25), rulers (\$15), and extra papers (\$?) from Peggy in Houlton. Program, Janet Melanson

Janet talked about batting and needles.

You need quality batting for quality quilts! If your batting has wrinkles, put it in the dryer for 60 seconds, or take out and let it relax for 24 hours. Some batting has scrim- that means it has a light fusing on the side that goes next to the quilt top, and allows you to quilt up to 10" apart. Wool batting MUST be preshrunk, cotton and poly cotton are optional depending on the look you are trying to create. One trick to determine the top side is to stab each side with a pin. If one is easier, it is the top. Also if there are dimples and pimples, the top is the dimples. All batting states the maximum distance between rows of Quilting. Do not use fusible for quilts, whether one sided or double sided, they should only be used for projects- bags, placemats, table runners, etc.

When disposing needles, please put them in containers to throw them out, people get stabbed by needles and pins in the trash! Schmitz needles has a great website for all sorts of needle information. Did you know that the lines on index cards are 1/4 inch apart? If you have an issue with with your needles rusting, try storing silica gel packs with them.

There is a great cheat sheet for diagonal blocks in the newsletter.

This month we will be discussing Half Square Triangles and how to make them. How many different ways are there? What can you make out of them? Pinwheels, Stars, Diagonal lines in quilts, and lots more. I learned at a Trunk show that there is a right side and wrong side to needles. If you can not thread your needle just turn it 180 degrees and thread it from the other side. This is because needles are not poured but the hole is punched so there

is a rough side. If anyone wants to learn how to make the fabric baskets I showed last month, see me at the break or before the meeting. I will have an info sheet with instructions. How are you coming on your UFO'5???? Only one month left!!!! Due in December.

Work shop Instructor

We are making Desert Sky on November 30th and December 1st with a trunk show on Friday night November 30th at 7pm. Everyone is welcome to the trunk show.

The cost is \$25.00 for the class. \$25.00 for the pattern and \$15.00 for the $\frac{1}{4}$ inch add on ruler \times 12".

I would like the \$25.00 for the class on September 10th at our regular Guild meeting to secure your place in the workshop and the rest at our November 5th meeting and I will have your pattern for you as there is some prep work for the work shop.

It takes 12 light/bright medium fabrics and 12 medium dark fabrics. The quilt is $48" \times 54"$ if you choose to make it bigger you will need more fabrics and more paper piecing sheets (which can be purchased from Peggy Crain of Rather be Quilting in Houlton ME) If you wish me to order you a booklet let me know so that she has them on hand for our class.

SUPER SATURDAY November 17, 2018

Snow Man Pillow Finished Size: 16" x 16"

This is a fun quick project that you can easily complete in one day. We will be teaching applique methods, both by machine and by hand – the choice is yours!

You can embellish your snowman as you please, and finish the pillow with a plain edge, or choose

another finish...rick rack, a flange or ruffle- so many possibilities.

* if you have never appliqued, bring a piece of scrap fabric to practise on

17" x 17" square of fabric for the pillow front

17" x 17" square of muslin or light fabric for pillow front backing

17" x WOF for pillow back (17" x 30 will actually suffice)

14" x 14" cream wool or fabric for snowman

6" x 12" of wool or fabric for scarf (you can use two different pieces of smaller scraps if desired- one for front of scarf and one for back of scarf)

3" x 6" rectangle of orange wool or fabric for carrot nose

20" x 20" square of batting (thin like Hobbs 80/20- not puffy polyester!)

½ yard of lightweight fusible web - like "Soft Fuse" or "Steam a Seam Light"

Threads to match or contrast - pearl cotton or embroidery floss for wool applique

16" x 16" pillow form

Optional: 16" x 12" piece of tear- away stabilizer if you are going to applique by machine – only if you have some already!

Embellishments:

(2) tiny black buttons for snowman eyes (or use embroidery floss)

buttons for snowman body

anything else you would like to add to make the pillow "yours"!!!!

Bring your machine and usual sewing kit and a Size 5 embroidery needle if you are doing hand applique.

Quilt Canada & challenge



The guild has agreed that we are going to do The Canadian Quilters' Association Member Guild Challenge. "Quilting Goes Viral."

This is the challenge:

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The Theme: "Quilting Goes Viral."

Please use Pantone, colour #18, Ultraviolet (the 2018 Colour of the year), or the equivalent KONA colour, Bright Periwinkle, along with up to two (2) additional colours on the face of your quilt You do not have to use the Kona brand, rather you should look for fabric that has the Pantone colour #18, periwinkle in it.
 The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72 inches. (18" square)
 Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow case
 style.

Please ensure that there is a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purpose.

All quilts must have a label with the Quilt name and Quilter's name visible on it. The guild can send one entry as a guild. For all the information please check their website at https://canadianquilter.com/member-guild-challenge-2019/
