

Ellen spoke about the upcoming workshop using the pattern Sunset Sky. The class was so popular that there will be two back to back workshops - Friday, Nov. 30, and Saturday Dec. 1. There are still a few spots available. The cost is \$25 and must be paid to secure your spot. Ellen will bulk order the patterns (\$25), rulers (\$15), and extra papers (\$?) from Peggy in Houlton. CQA

We belong to the Canadian Quilting Association. They are having a challenge using the Pantone or Kona color of the year. The quilt will have a maximum perimeter of 72" (I.e. 18" x 18"), use only a maximum of 2 additional colors, have a sleeve, and be with them for 11 months. Members who would like to challenge for our entry need their project completed for the April meeting. Members will vote for their favourite. Janet Wright will email the details.

Super Saturday, Betty Doherty and Sue Hayden

The first Super Saturday is September 22. The project is a stack and whack set of placemats. 4 fat quarters and 1 yard of backing, or 8 fat quarters and 2 yards of backing are needed, as well as fusible fleece. The second Super Saturday is a quilted rug made from a jelly roll. One jelly roll, sewn end to end seams open, the same length of quilt batting cut 2 1/4" wide (great way to use up all those bits and pieces), jeans needles, and lots and lots of thread are required.

Retreat, Janet Wright and Diane Scott

45 people have so far signed up! Anyone who has a table with folding legs, could they bring them. There is a fabric challenge, the fabric was handed out, or will be mailed out to not at the meeting attendees. You will be keeping the item, and there will be a prize for the favourite.

Quilt Show, Betty Doherty and Sue Hayden

Set up will be on May 2nd with the show on May 3rd and 4th. The theme is Pieces of Time. There will be a section for items from each year of the guild. The committees are up and running. Volunteer signups will be in the new year, as well as the raffle tickets for the raffle quilt. The quilt was held up for viewing. We are having more racks made for the show. There should be twice as many as in 2017.

Program, Janet Melanson

Janet asked what can one do with a pool noodle? Slice it up, cut in half, and you have pin cushions. Or use one to roll a quilt, rather than fold it.

Janet demonstrated 2 quilt techniques. The first was using 8 same sized squares. 4 are the backgrounds, 4 are the folded pin wheels. Fold pin wheel square in half, wrong sides together. Stitch to background square. When yo sew the 4 together, bend the corner of each pin wheel before you sew it. The second was how to make a Dresden plate. You need 20 wedges. Fold them in half vertically and sew across the wider end. Flip right side out to make a pointed wedge. Join twenty together in a circle. Use a suitable sized centre circle for the whole in the middle. Appliqué on a background square.

Janet challenged each of us to find a UFO and finish it some how some way. Due for December meeting.

Community Quilts, Kathy Boone

Kathy requested that anyone requesting a quilt to please contact any one of the three on the committee. They will be putting out quilts that members can pick up. They kits will be signed out and signed back in for tracking purposes. There is a need for large quilts (especially for fire victims). There will be work days set up for volunteers to complete quilts. The committee will not be delivering the quilts, that will be the job of the person requesting the quilt. And please remember that all quilts need a label.

Riverside Quilting, Trish Robinson

Quilting at Riverside will start on Tuesday, September 18, and will continue every other Tuesday until Christmas. Please see Trish to sign up as she needs 4-6 volunteers each time. The residents at Riverside both appreciate and benefit from this initiative. Set up is at noon, and tea and cookies are at 2:00 pm. If you are free on a Tuesday afternoon please consider volunteering.

Winners were: Dorothy Walls, Kathy Boone, and Sharon Dickinson.


A few other items came up during the meeting:

Welcome to a new season of quilting and collecting all those unused scraps for the cats. <u>Terry Harcombe has consented to look after the collection and</u> distributing of the beds for this quilting season.

So, continue to bring in your completed beds to the monthly meetings and Terry will collect and store them until there is sufficient beds to deliver to the DunRomin and/or Debec animal shelters as needed.

Just a friendly reminder that the size of the beds should be around 14 by 20 inches. An old pillow case cut in half pretty much meets this requirement. Please don't overstuff them but they should be fill enough to be able to soften the metal bars that they cover. Remember....no pins, needles, paper or other unwanted items should be in the stuffing.....only cotton scraps, minky type scraps and cut up pieces of scrap batting is to be used for the stuffing.

Please make sure that you bring in finished beds. Terry will not have time to take your scraps to make the beds....she would like to do her own quilting.

Work shop Instructor

We are making Desert Sky on November 30th and December 1st with a trunk show on Friday night November 30th at 7pm. Everyone is welcome to the trunk show.

The cost is \$25.00 for the class. \$25.00 for the pattern and \$15.00 for the $\frac{1}{4}$ inch add on ruler \times 12".

I would like the \$25.00 for the class on September 10th at our regular Guild meeting to secure your place in the workshop and the rest at our November 5th meeting and I will have your pattern for you as there is some prep work for the work shop.

It takes 12 light/bright medium fabrics and 12 medium dark fabrics. The quilt is $48" \times 54"$ if you choose to make it bigger you will need more fabrics and more paper piecing sheets (which can be purchased from Peggy Crain of Rather be Quilting in Houlton ME) If you wish me to order you a booklet let me know so that she has them on hand for our class.

Super Saturday Floor Mat Materials October 27th, 2018-09-28

1 jelly roll (or 40 2 ½" strips)

1600" or so of 2 ¼" strips of quilt batting (NOT thick polyester – use thin type such as Hobbs 80/20)

Note! Can be different brands of batting. Do not join strips! LOTS of thread! Pre-wind 4-5 bobbins if possible. Can be co-ordinating or contrasting.

Jeans needle

IMPORTANT!!!!!!!

Preparation: Join all your jelly roll strips end to end at 45 degrees. Trim and press seams open. Fold accordion style (about 12-15" lengths). Loosely tie towards each end. This accordion of fabric will sit on your lap as you sew.

Bring your standard sewing kit and extension table for your machine if you have one.

The Theme: "Quilting Goes Viral."

Please use Pantone, colour #18, Ultraviolet (the 2018 Colour of the year), or the equivalent KONA colour, Bright Periwinkle, along with up to two (2) additional colours on the face of your quilt You do not have to use the Kona brand, rather you should look for fabric that has the Pantone colour #18, periwinkle in it.
 The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72 inches. (18" square)
 Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow case style.

Please ensure that there is a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purpose.

All quilts must have a label with the Quilt name and Quilter's name visible on it. The guild can send one entry as a guild. For all the information please check their website at https://canadianquilter.com/member-guild-challenge-2019/

Diagonal Blocks

Cutting And Sewing Them Accurately

any quilt blocks look their best set on point. If you're following a pattern from a quilt book or magazine you don't usually have to worry about doing the math for the dimensions for cutting out the setting or corner triangles. Quilters sew many quilts without the benefit of step by step directions. I used to think it was all right to take the measurement of my finished block size and add 7/8", then cut a square and cut that in half to get a setting triangle. After a few wobbly edged quilts that inevitably sagged from the bias edge of the long side of the setting triangles, I took closer notice of what other professional quilters were doing. At first, I didn't want to hear because it involved difficult numbers and complicated formulas. But, the

results were so much better and my quilts no longer had rippling edges! I use my calculator to do the division.

To stabilize the sides of the quilt top and to prevent it from stretching along the outside edges, it is important that the corner and side triangles are cut so that the STRAIGHT grain runs horizontally and vertically.


CORNER TRIANGLES are cut from a square sliced along one diagonal yielding two triangles. The formula for the size of square to start with is: The finished block size DIVIDED by 1.414, with .875" (7/8") added for seam allowances. Always round your answer up to the nearest 1/8". For a 12" block the formula is: 12" + 1.414 = 8.486". Round up to 8.5" and add .875" (7/8") for 9-3/8". That is the size of square to cut to yield two of the needed four corner triangles. You will need two 9-3/8" squares.


SIDE/SETTING TRIAN-GLES are also cut from a square, only this time it will be cut along both diagonals to yield four triangles. The formula for the size square to start with is: The finished size of the block MULTIPLIED by 1.414, with 1-1/4" added for seam allowances. Again, always round up to the nearest 1/8". For a 12" block the formula is: 12" x 1.414 = 16.968". Round up to 17" and add 1.25" (1-1/4") for a total measurement of 18-1/4". Each 18-1/4" square will yield four side/setting triangles.




To figure the diagonal measurement of a quilt block set on point, the formula is: block size multiplied by 1.414. I took out my trusty calculator and did the math for the following standard sized blocks. I've also included the size of square to cut to get the needed corner and side triangles for setting the corresponding blocks.
