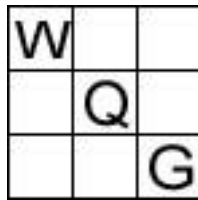

We would like to ask the guild members who have taken quilt kits out last year & not returned them yet to please have them in by the October/November meetings so we can start putting new kits out. This includes Food Bank quilts . They are included here because the money earned from raffling them benefits the community at large. Some of these have been out for a very long time. It is now felt by us that there should be a time limit on quilt kits of 2-3 months.

We have on hand 5 large quilts to be quilted for community quilts & 12 quilts (all that's left & yes I finally got the tops done!) for the food bank. We really need a quilting day to get some of these done! Any suggestions as to when would be a good time? We realize this is a Quilt Show year & people will be busy but we mustn't forget our obligations. There also is the commitment to the hospital for baby quilts so kits for them will also be forthcoming.

Let's have a really productive year & not forget those in need.

Cat bed report

Welcome to a new season of quilting and collecting all those unused scraps for the cats. *Terry Harcombe has consented to look after the collection and distributing of the beds for this quilting season.*

So, continue to bring in your completed beds to the monthly meetings and Terry will collect and store them until there is sufficient beds to deliver to the DunRomin and/or Debec animal shelters as needed.

Just a friendly reminder that the size of the beds should be around 14 by 20 inches. An old pillow case cut in half pretty much meets this requirement. Please don't overstuff them but they should be fill enough to be able to soften the metal bars that they cover. Remember....no pins, needles, paper or other unwanted items should be in the stuffing.....only cotton scraps, minky type scraps and cut up pieces of scrap batting is to be used for the stuffing.

Please make sure that you bring in finished beds. Terry will not have time to take your scraps to make the beds....she would like to do her own quilting.

The cost is \$25.00 for the class. \$25.00 for the pattern and \$15.00 for the $\frac{1}{4}$ inch add on ruler x 12".

It takes 12 light/bright medium fabrics and 12 medium dark fabrics. The quilt is 48" x 54" if you choose to make it bigger you will need more fabrics and more paper piecing sheets (which can be purchased from Peggy Crain of Rather be Quilting in Houlton ME) If you wish me to order you a booklet let me know so that she has them on hand for our class.

The Canadian Quilters' Association/Association canadienne de la courtepointe is announcing a **Member Guild Challenge**. Only members of a CQA/ACC Member Guild may enter this challenge, which has the theme "**Quilting Goes Viral**."

This is the challenge:

- The Theme: "Quilting Goes Viral."
- Please use Pantone, colour #18, Ultraviolet (the 2018 Colour of the year), or the equivalent KONA colour, Bright Periwinkle, along with up to two (2) additional colours on the face of your quilt
- The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72 inches.
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings or enveloped pillow case style.
- Please ensure that there is a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purpose.
- All quilts must have a label with the Quilt name and Quilter's name visible on it.
- Please enclose the Guild Entry Form when your quilt is shipped.

The guild can send one entry as a guild. If we are interested we will have a viewer`s choice vote in April`s meeting. For all the information please check their website at <https://canadianquilter.com/member-guild-challenge-2019/>
