SUPER SATURDAY

Join Janet W for a class on machine quilting on your domestic sewing machine. It will be held **Mar 16th**. Janet will talk more at the meeting about the different options on what you can make this day. It is going to be a basic machine quilting class. If you have not machine

quilted before, it is recommended that you practice, practice, practice at the class. If you have some knowledge, you may want to either do the crow pattern that Janet is going to show, or to bring a piece of floral fabric (something you can quilt around) or a pillow panel. Or you can look thru coloring books and pick out your own pattern, just remember to keep it simple. We will be touching on the process of how to do trapunto (an extra layer of batting that makes parts of your surface more "puffy" than others). We will also be looking at the process of quilting blocks then putting them together into a larger quilt.

What to bring (must have):

sewing machine in good working order. A free motion quilting foot for your machine (also called a darning foot). Threads (lots of different colors, contrast to your practice piece and matching if you are doing a project, preferably polyester threads). Small sharp scissors, applique foot for your machine ONLY if you are going to make the crow or another applique pattern. Machine needles incase you bend one. Safety pins. Seam ripper. You need a practice sandwich, you will need about two half yard cuts. Pick something you think is ugly from your stash. We will be using this to practice on. You will also need a piece of batting that will fit in between these.

Bring ONLY if you have:

the safety pin helper (it is a tool for putting pins in), friction pens, machine's owner manual, spray baste, gloves, an extension table for your machine (not really needed). Self threading hand needles.

If you are making the crow, or another similar pattern. Trace crow onto fusing and then fuse onto the fabric. Cut out. Fuse to a 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" of background fabric. Cut out one 12 1/2" piece of batting and one 14" piece of batting. You will also need a 14" piece of backing fabric. DO NOT APPLIQUE THE PIECE!!!!!

Super Saturday for May:

Susan Hayden will teach the Chenille Runner. Here are the materials needed.

3 pieces of print fabric - repeats approx 24" x width of fabric (large print works best)

1 piece of backing 26" X WOF (a solid that coordinates with the print)

1 piece of backing 28" x WOF (this can be the print fabric or the solid)

Other supplies:

1 piece of batting 28" x 44"

thread to coordinate with your print and backing

chenille cutter if you have one - I have one and so do a few other people and we can share them on Super Saturday.

We need a policy for borrowing quilt racks and how to transport them. The rental fee is used for repairs and replacements. Catherine will draft a policy.

Bookmarks to advertise the quilt show were passed out.

Market - a list was available for people to sign up for things we want to sell in the market so we can judge space needed.

Updated registration form available – new categories added; changed drop off time to 12:30 Selling Tickets – Linda Markey will be looking for helpers to sell quilt show tickets at Sobey's on March 8th from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and again on April 19th from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Linda will also need workers to sell tickets during the actual Quilt Show. So please give some thought to what time you could give to this event.

Demonstration of preparing proper quilt sleeves – if you have a very large quilt to exhibit at the show, the hanger must be attached to the back of the quilt. The measurement should be 96" from the base of the quilt to the top of the sleeve and this will prevent the need for pinning the bottom of the quilt so that it won't touch the floor. For how to make and attach a quilt hanger sleeve you can Google "quilt hanging sleeve." Sleeves should be 5" wide Super Saturday – Feb 16 Judy Boyd will teach Pioneer Braid. Bring material to make templates. This is a scrappy quilt using $2\frac{3}{4}$ " strips; good chance to learn colour values. Sunshine – Shelley is doing sunshine for Feb/March so if cards need to be sent out, call her.

Fons & Porter's Quilt Tips:

- Place an old pillowcase over your ironing board to protect the cover when using fusible webbing

- Nothing is too small to be useful. Use tiny scraps to stuff toys or pillows.
