

I have Darcy coming on October 9th to teach us how to do some birds. It will only cost you \$25.00 and the guild pays the balance. This will include the pattern and the canvas to mount your finished project. You will need to bring you sewing machine, thread lots of colours and all you sewing stuff you might need. The fabric depends on what bird you intend to do. For instance red for the cardinal and a little black. Blue bird you will need some blue and white. If you don't have email she can send it to me and I can print it out for you and give it to you.

#### 5" charm swap

Choose a good quality fabric that is in the guidelines, preferably pre washed. Square up. Cut one 5" strip from the width of fabric. Cut off all salvages. Sub cut into eight 5" squares. Set one aside for yourself. Place 7 charms into a ziploc bag and place your name and the name of the swap in or on the bag. ie Janet W blue

You may do multiple sets (up to 3) within each section, but each set must be a different fabric. Only good quality fabric cut accurately. You may turn in the whole year at once if you wish also.

Sept – novelty – any color any print, lights to darks

Oct – yellow - all over color is yellow, prints allowed, lights to darks

Nov – orange - all over color is orange, prints allowed, lights to darks

Dec – Purple - all over color is purple, prints allowed, lights to darks

Jan – pink - all over color is pink, prints allowed, lights to darks

Feb – pastel - all over color is pastel, prints allowed, lights only

March – green - all over color is green, prints allowed, lights to darks

April – red - all over color is red, prints allowed, lights to darks

May – gray - all over color is gray, prints allowed, lights to darks

June – Anything goes, any color (good way to dump the ones you didn't like)

## **Quilting at Riverside, September 2021**

The Riverside Court Retirement Residence is open to quilting again every alternate Tuesday in the afternoon beginning on September 28th if we can get enough volunteers together for the event. Four to six ladies would be great. At the moment, I am not sure how many actual seniors will want to quilt which will mean that the volunteers will do the quilting.

When you come into the building, you need to wear a mask and then sign in at the registration desk. Masks do not need to be worn while quilting if there are no seniors actually quilting. If there are seniors around the frame, then masks are to be worn. If the seniors are only interested in watching, then masks are not necessary Any movement around the building by quilter volunteers requires that they wear a mask (i.e. elevators, stairs, tea room, etc.). Mask wearing is up to you except as described above.

A signup sheet will be at the registration/draws table if you are interested. Please do consider donating some of you time to this valuable event.

Volunteers need to come to the main dining room at 12:50 p.m. and work with the seniors until tea time which usually begins around 2:00 p.m. If you are able to stay for tea and cookies and socialize with the seniors, that would be great too. We usually finish around 2:30 p.m.
