Fabric requirements for both projects are included below:
I. WQG Mystery Quilt 2023/24: Falmouth Fiber Mystery Quilt (52 x 70")

This mystery sew along will be hosted by our very own Lynn Dirusso, who also designed the piece!
The mystery sew along will span 7 months, October 2023-April 2024.

## Fabric requirements:

1. Focus Fabric (medium/large scale print) -2 yards
2. Light Fabric -2.5 yards
3. Medium Fabric -0.5 yards
4. Dark Fabric I-1.25 yards
5. Dark Fabric II -0.5 yards
6. Dark Fabric III -0.5 yards
II. WQG 25 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary Row Quilt Along ( $60.5 \times 63.5^{\prime \prime}$ )

It's our $25^{\text {th }}$ anniversary, and I'm looking forward to celebrating the milestone with you as we construct this quilt together, row by row!

This quilt along will span 7 months, October 2023-April 2024, with a break for the month of December.

## Fabric requirements*:

1. 1-1/8 yards navy blue (rows $1-6$ )
2. $1 / 2$ yard red circle (rows $1,2,5$, and 6 )
3. $5 / 8$ yard aqua circle (rows 1,2 , and 5 )
4. 1/4 yard multicolor circle (rows 1 and 6 )
5. 1 yard cream-and-multicolor circle (rows 1 and 5 backgrounds)
6. 1 yard cream swirl (rows 2 and 5 backgrounds)
7. $2 / 3$ yard cream flower (row 3 background)
8. $2 / 3$ yard cream circle (rows 4 and 6 backgrounds)
9. 23 yard red sun (rows 3,4 , and 6 )
10. $1 / 4$ yard aqua swirl (rows 4 and 6 )
11. $3 / 8$ yard multicolor swirl (rows 3 and 4)
12. $1 / 4$ yard gray circle (rows 2 and 3 )
13. $3 / 4$ yard green (rows $2,3,5$, and 6 )
$14.5 / 8$ yard binding fabric
3-7/8 yards backing fabric
$69 \times 72$ " batting

## Pattern for Row 1 (October):

## Materials for Row 1

- $1 / 4$ yard navy blue batik
- $9 \times 21$ " piece (fat eighth) red circle batik
- $9 \times 21$ " piece (fat eighth) aqua circle batik
- $9 \times 21$ " piece (fat eighth) multicolor circle batik
- 2/3 yard cream-and-multicolor circle batik (background)

Finished block in Row 1: 12" square
Finished Row 1: 12×60"
Yardages and cutting instructions are based on 42" of usable fabric width.
Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

## Cut Fabrics for Row 1

Cut pieces in the following order.
From navy blue batik, cut: • $36-2$ " squares
From red circle batik, cut: • $24-2$ " squares
From aqua circle batik, cut: • $3-6.5$ " squares
From multicolor circle batik, cut: • $2-6.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares
From cream-and-multicolor circle batik, cut:

- 5-2.5 $\times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
- $20-2.5 \times 6.5$ " rectangles
- 20-3.5" squares


## Assemble Row 1

1. Use a pencil or chalk pencil to mark a diagonal line on wrong side of each navy blue batik 2 " square and red circle batik 2 " square.
2. Align a marked navy blue batik square with each corner of an aqua circle batik $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ square (Diagram 1). Stitch on each marked line; trim seam allowances to $1 / 4$ ". Press navy blue triangles open to make an aqua center unit. Repeat to make three aqua center units total.
3. Using marked red circle batik squares and multicolor circle batik 6.5" squares, repeat Step 2 to make two multicolor center units (Diagram 2).
4. Align a marked navy blue batik square with one corner of a cream-and-multicolor circle batik 3.5" square. Stitch, trim, and press as before to make a blue unit A (Diagram 3). Repeat to make 12 total of blue unit A. Using red circle batik instead of navy blue circle batik, repeat to make eight of red unit A.
5. Referring to Diagram 4, add marked navy blue batik squares and marked red circle batik squares to indicated corners of cream-and-multicolor circle batik $2.5 \times 6.5$ " rectangles to make six each of blue units $B$ and $C$ and four each of red units $B$ and $C$.
6. Referring to Diagram 5, lay out four blue $A$ units, two blue $B$ units, and two blue $C$ units around an aqua center unit. Sew together A units in pairs. Press seam open. Then join pieces in each horizontal row; press seams open. Join rows; press seams in one direction. Add a cream-and-multicolor circle batik $2.5 \times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle to bottom edge to make a blue block. Press seam toward rectangle. The block should be 12.5 square including seam allowances. Repeat to make three blue blocks total.
7. Using red units and multicolor center units, repeat Step 6 to make two red blocks.
8. Referring to Quilt Assembly Diagram, join blue and red blocks to make Row 1; note rotation of red blocks. Press seams in one direction.
